This custody allows us to use a quantity of the maple trees near our facilities for lumber—it keeps our supply consistent without causing deforestation!

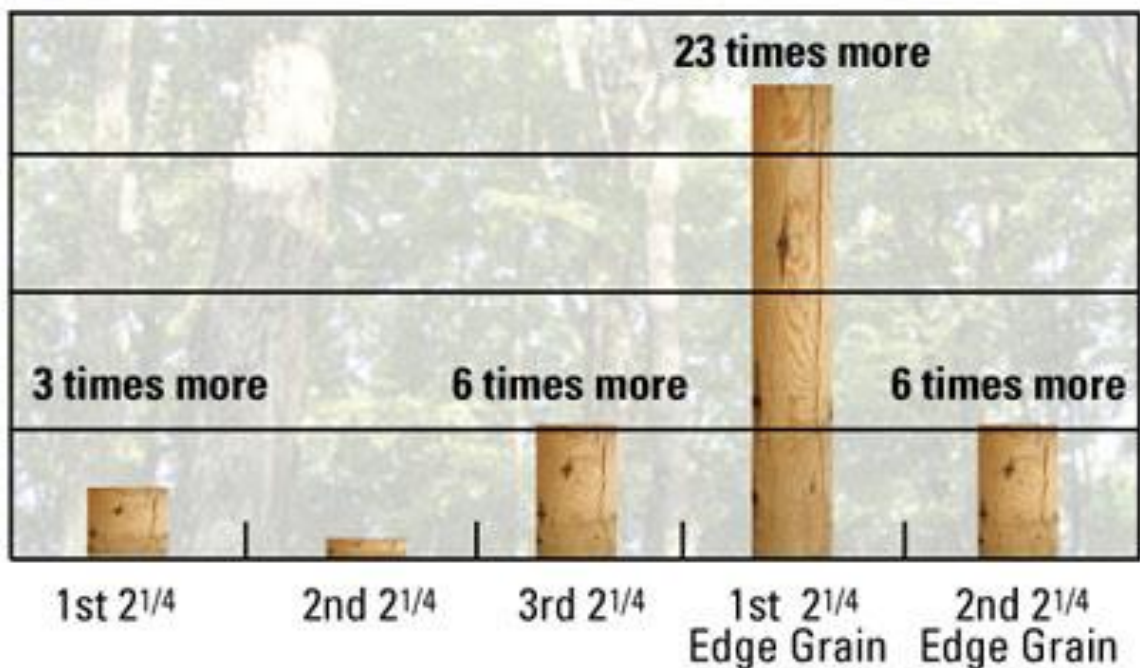


# CHAPTER 4:

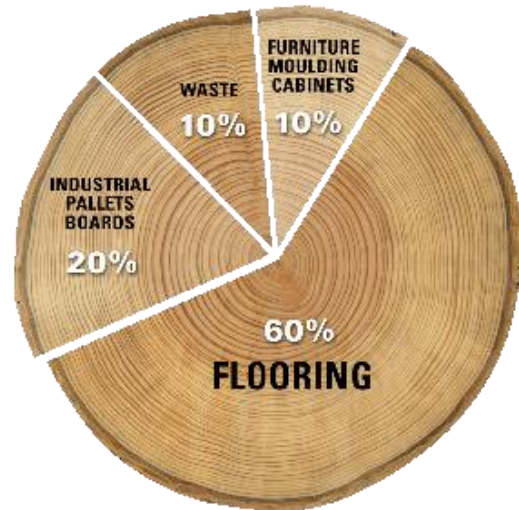
## LEED

In addition to regulations from the FSC, Horner's designs are also LEED-compliant. Our subfloors can be made in part with post-consumer recycled materials, combined with sustainably harvested hardwood and plywood.

## Percentage of Maple Log by Grade for Sustainable Design



If post-consumer recycled materials, sustainably harvested hardwood, and plywood are necessary for your new floor, make sure the gym floor contractor is aware.

When considering green choices, consider a water based finish to reduce the BOC content. Some state and local laws limit BOC amounts.
